# Addressing Critical Issues: Workforce Recruitment & Phase 3 RoPs

One of the main goals of the AHCA/NCAL Convention & Expo is to prepare attendees to return to their centers and businesses with more knowledge, skills, and information needed to face the sector's most pressing issues. This year, AHCA/NCAL is focusing specifically on Workforce Development and Updated (Phase 3) Requirements of Participation (RoPs).

Below is an outline of the content that is relevant to one or both of this year's critical issues.

# Workforce Development Workforce Recruitment and Retention Intensive

Sunday, October 9, 2022 1:00 PM - 4:00 PM CT

Workforce issues abound, requiring providers to not only think outside the box but restructure the box itself. This session will provide an overview of the current workforce demographics and trends as a springboard to discuss innovative and proven methods to address workforce challenges. Several speakers will participate in panels to provide you with ideas to take back to your own organization. You will leave the session with actionable steps to inform your recruitment and retention strategies.

# Special Focus: Phase 3 Requirements of Participation

# New and Updated CMS Guidance and Implications: Phase 3 RoPs and More

Sunday, October 9, 2022, repeated on Wednesday, October, 12, 2022 1:00 PM - 4:00 PM CT

This session will review the Phase 2 and 3 new and updated RoP guidance that surveyors will begin using to identify non-compliance on October 24, 2022. The presentation will walk the participants through what areas of the guidance are new or have been revised, how surveyors will drill down to determine compliance, actions providers should take to ensure compliance, and resources AHCA has developed to assist.

# Addressing Relocation Stress in Dementia Care

Monday, October 10, 2022 7:45 AM - 9:00 AM CT

Easing the transition from home to a long-term care community remains a challenge for many organizations.

For most, the move is a last resort. A diagnosis of dementia heightens the individual's emotions and increases the risks of untoward events, such as falls, altercations, and elopements. This session offers an overview of the revised Federal regulations for admission, transfer, and discharge and guidance in policy development. Insight into understanding and addressing relocation stress for people impacted by dementia is a focus of this conversation.

## Non-Traditional LTC Infection Preventionists - The Time Is Now!

### Monday, October 10, 2022 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM CT

During this presentation, you will learn how to leverage the MPH graduate's knowledge to best meet the needs of the complex LTC infection prevention program. The risks and benefits of the non-traditional approach will be explored with this staffing endeavor. Successful mentoring and onboarding strategies will be discussed. Competency development will be explained. Challenges with the facility cultural and social integration and becoming a prominent member of the interdisciplinary team will be examined. Lessons learned with engagement and retention will be highlighted. Perspectives from successful, professionally engaged, LTC MPH IPs will also be shared.

# Rounding Up Recent Regulatory and Survey Developments

# Monday, October 10, 2022 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM CT

This session will round up the latest federal regulatory revisions and additions, both proposed and final. During the COVID-19 health pandemic, CMS has issued multiple blanket waivers to its post-acute regulations. The session will answer the question of what happened to the 2019 proposed regulations, as well as the guidance on the Phase 3 elements of the requirements of participation. This session will also review the top survey trends and top citations. The goal of the session is to "herd up" this information and help you understand the key regulatory changes and survey trends, as well as what has stayed, what has gone, and what the new administration is working on.

# Adverse Event Response: Elopement & Abuse

# Monday, October 10, 2022 3:15 PM - 4:15 PM CT

This session will review best practices for investigating and responding to adverse events related to elopements and abuse, with an emphasis on the root cause and QAPI process. Example scenarios will be presented. The session will also cover considerations for best practices related to implementing internal investigations and documentation practices related to adverse events.

# Infection Prevention and Control During Staffing Shortages

## Tuesday, October 11, 2022 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM CT

Through the COVID-19 pandemic, long term care providers have become experts in infection control, screening, testing, PPE, and isolation requirements. As the pandemic continued into 2022, the nation hit a second-tier crisis: that of our workforce. In this session we will share strategies implemented to maintain key principles of infection control, while navigating limited staffing. These needs will continue as we emerge out of the pandemic, rise to higher levels of infection control requirements, and navigate the ongoing workforce crisis while continuing to meet a high level of quality in resident outcomes.

# Warm Handoffs: Ethical Considerations in Transfer of Care

## Tuesday, October 11, 2022 8:00 AM - 9:00 AM CT

Challenged by transfer of care between hospitals and post-acute care facilities? You are not alone. Administrators and nursing leadership in both settings struggle. What previously required only a few key pieces of information about a patient has evolved into a complex process with multiple opportunities for failure. Risks exist that are associated with inaccurate or incomplete transfer of information affecting resident and patient safety, resulting in the potential

for harm. The goal is to provide quality care while preventing hospital readmissions. Readmissions are not only costly to the providers, resulting in financial penalties, but equally as costly to the patient. Readmissions can be traumatic, affecting health outcomes, morbidity, and even mortality. In a recent study published in the Journal of Hospital *Medicine* that explored the perspective of patients related to readmission, 28% reported not feeling ready for their discharge and 56% never phoned their physician before returning to the hospital. This brings up the question: are our discharge processes and protocol adequate? Are we doing everything we can to prepare our patients for a successful discharge? It is clear that reliable communication between all parties is paramount for effective transfers. But what are the best practice guidelines related to this? In this session, risk areas related to transfers between post-acute settings will be reviewed along with practical strategies providers can implement to mitigate this risk.

# Making the Linkage Between Competencies & QAPI

Tuesday, October 11, 2022 9:30 AM - 10:30 AM CT

Competencies: the "four letter word" that may make some operators question yet another task to be done and to check off the to-do list. This session will spotlight the concept of staff competencies and competent staff as well as highlight the value of the practice of competency

monitoring. The speaker will emphasize the association between standards of practice, staff competencies, and an effective QAPI program, for both the nursing home as well as assisted living facilities. Sample tools and scenarios will be used to demonstrate the meaningful connection between training requirements, competent staff, QAPI, and other key regulations.

# Compliance Programs: Why Does "Effectiveness" Matter?

### Tuesday, October 11, 2022 1:45 PM - 2:45 PM CT

We all know that SNFs must have a compliance program, but the mere presence of a compliance program does not mean that it works or that it's effective. The government expects compliance programs to effectively prevent and detect fraud, waste, and abuse. In fact, an effective compliance program can decrease penalties in cases of wrongdoing. So how do you achieve effectiveness? This session will discuss the regulatory background and expectation of effectiveness, describe what effectiveness looks like, and give some practical tips to achieving compliance program effectiveness, as well as provide a tool to help you measure/demonstrate your program's effectiveness.

# How Using Interprofessional Competencies Strengthened Our Workplace

Wednesday, October 12, 2022 9:30 AM - 10:30 AM CT Achieving compliance with evolving CMS requirements of participation is a constant challenge for communities. There is a demand to balance evidence-based person-centered care with safety and quality. All members of the team need individualized training that collectively results in expert clinical and non-clinical skills performance. This session will describe a non-profit academic-provider partnership in which adaptable programming was designed to address person-centered care CMS requirements. Maximize your efforts by strategically using local expertise to adopt evidence-based education, training, policies, and maintenance of competencies for both clinical and nonclinical (i.e., values, ethics, diversity, communication, etc.) skills.

# Survey Tips and Preparing for Phase 3 RoPs

### Wednesday, October 12, 2022 9:30 AM - 10:30 AM CT

CMS is rolling out the Phase 3 RoPs and has updated or clarified many existing tags. Surveyors are currently going through preliminary training to be prepared for an end of October roll out. You need to be prepared too! We will review and discuss these changes and how to maintain compliance. The presenter will discuss his experience with those issues and ways facilities have successfully managed these systems based on nearly 20 years of experience as a surveyor and surveyor trainer.
